

Professionals and Technicians

Professionals

The professionals listed below are not subject to this chapter.

1. All professionals in health, education, social services and related fields, including:
 - (a) managers of health services, educational services and social or community services;
 - (b) physicians, dentists, optometrists, chiropractors and other health professionals;
 - (c) pharmacists, dietitians and nutritionists;
 - (d) therapy and assessment professionals;
 - (e) nursing professionals;
 - (f) psychologists and social workers;
 - (g) professors and teaching assistants at university level;
 - (h) teachers at the college level and in vocational schools;
 - (i) secondary, primary and pre-school teachers and guidance counsellors.
2. All professionals attached to cultural industries, as defined in Article 2208 (Exceptions - Definitions), including:
 - (a) managers of libraries, archives, museums and art galleries;
 - (b) managers in the fields of publishing, film, broadcasting and the performing arts;
 - (c) professionals in the visual and performing arts.
3. Directors of sports, recreation and fitness programs and services.
4. The managers of telecommunications transmission.
5. Managers of postal and courier services.
6. Manufacturing managers.
7. Managers of utilities.
8. Construction and transportation managers.
9. Judges, lawyers and notaries, with the exception of foreign legal consultants.

Technicians

The technicians listed below are subject to this Chapter.

1. Civil engineering technologists and technicians.
2. Mechanical engineering technologists and technicians.
3. Industrial and manufacturing engineering technologists and technicians.
4. Construction inspectors and estimators.
5. Engineering inspectors and auditors and regulatory officers.
6. Supervisors in the following areas: machinists and related occupations, printing and related occupations, mining and quarrying, drilling and services related to oil and gas extraction, metal and mineral processing, oil refining, gas and chemical processing and utilities, food, beverage and tobacco processing, manufacture of rubber and plastic products, processing of forest products, and processing of textile products.
7. Contractors and foremen in the following areas: electricity and telecommunications; piping; metal forming, shaping and assembly; carpentry; mechanical; heavy construction crews; and other construction trades and repair and installation services.
8. Electronic and electrical technologists and technicians.
9. Electricians.
10. Plumbers.
11. Technicians and mechanics of industrial instruments.
12. Mechanics, technicians and controllers of avionics and aircraft instruments and electrical equipment.
13. Mining and preparation miners, underground mines.
14. Drillers and testing personnel and other services relating to the extraction of oil and gas.
15. Graphic designers and illustrators.
16. Interior designers.
17. Chiefs.
18. Computer systems technicians.
19. International purchasing and sales agents.
